

NUTRITION MINOR

The Nutrition minor provides students with a foundation of knowledge in nutritional sciences, food systems, and food studies and their relationships to population health. Through an examination of food and nutrition policies and practices affecting sustainable diets and long-term health, students gain a multidisciplinary perspective of the food environment, including the interplay of food and nutrition, human behavior, business, culture, and the environment. Students access evidence-based information and become informed consumers, while also applying these skills to their main area of study.
